Call for Papers

The American Chemical Society Florida Chemistry Conclave hosted by the Central Florida student chapters is pleased to welcome papers that fall under the theme “Where Chemistry Abounds.”

The theme for the first annual ACSFCC was chosen to encompass our love of chemistry. Chemistry provides the common link between many science disciplines, from the bonds that hold our cell membranes together to the quantum mechanical forces between atoms, from nano-particle drug rehabilitation to nuclear energy. As such, all papers that integrate chemistry in some fashion fall under this theme.

The research portion will be separated into 10 minute oral presentations with a total of 20 presentations. Only undergraduate students may apply. Please submit an abstract of no more than 400 words and CV for consideration. Projects in progress will also be considered.
